Pastor’s Corner Stewardship Focus On the Inside



My dear Family,

I received a timely letter from the Archbishop’s Office this week that I would like to share with you:

“Dear Pastors,

It is that time of year when people may be tempted to dress very casually when they come to Mass. I ask you to please remind them to dress in a manner that shows respect to Our Lord, especially when they come forward to receive the Eucharist. Remind them that it is not good if their manner of dress causes others to be distracted and may lead to thoughts of lust.

My office receives several phone calls and letters stating people’s disgust when they witness people dress in clothing that is too tight, too short, too low cut, etc. in Mass

INTIMATE WITH OUR FAITH ANSWERING CHRIST’S CALL

In the June edition of *People of God* Archbishop Sheehan wrote about attending Sunday Mass in order to be a good Catholic. Most likely, if you’re reading this, you attended Mass this weekend so that point may not be an issue for you. He also wrote about the fact that we are part of the Christian community and that community provides numerous opportunities plus sustaining friendships.

In the last sentence he addressed the fact that Sunday Mass attendance is only the beginning of our faith: “Much more is needed if we are to allow our faith to be an intimate part of our lives.” This should be a familiar theme to those who follow this column.

If you look up synonyms for “intimate” you’ll find words like “close, dear, cherished, and warm.” They describe a faith that is much different than the typical expectations of our secular society and, unfortunately, the majority of Catholics today. Mass attendances is

an excellent example of how Catholics today are far less intimate with their faith than 50 years ago.

In 1958, 74% of Catholics stated they attended Mass weekly. Today, it's in the low to mid 30%! Of those, less than 30% use their envelopes (make some sort of donation to support their parishes) and an even smaller percentage do more with the Church than attend Mass! (These data come from Gallup surveys.)

The really sad news is future trends appear far worse! Broken down by generations, younger generations are much less likely to attend Mass weekly than their elders! Why? **They see their parents' examples and those get worse every year!** One might ask what is happening to Catholics' faith intimacy. Simply put, faith to the majority of Catholics today is an **occasional Mass** and perhaps **sacraments** that are more **like social events** than true sacraments tied to our lives' passages (Baptism, First Communion, Confirmation, and Marriage).

Lost intimacy begins with the minimalist approach to faith—weekly Mass attendance. If that is all we do, and not regularly, **we have lost that intimate relationship with Christ.** We have lost the opportunity to build lasting friendships within our faith community. We have ignored our baptismal call to serve in Christ's name. We are no longer intimate with our faith!

Is this the example of faith you want to pass on to your children, grandchildren, friends, and neighbors? Are you a Catholic in name only? Does it matter to you if you follow the precepts of your faith and answer Christ's call to be His disciple? If it still matters, prepare now for our Stewardship of time and talent weekend 15/16 August. God calls each one of us to follow Him. He is calling you today. **Be ready to answer His call!**
