BELIEVING AND LIVING THE EUCHARISTIC VIRTUES PART II

Last month we covered **Faith** and **Repentance**, the first two Eucharistic Virtues, and their relationship to living stewardship. (Call 892-1511 x358 or E-mail Bulletin@stanm.org for a copy.) Our faith life is a complicated matrix of numerous intertwined elements which results in a complete approach to our spiritual lives. Among other things, Eucharistic virtues give us the necessary strength to be good stewards.

The third Eucharistic Virtue is **Prayer**. One of the best ways to pray is in Christ’s Company at the **Perpetual Adoration Chapel**. There we can be with His Holiness, holiness from His **Real Presence** 24/7. Remember what God told us, **“Without me you can do nothing.”** (Deuteronomy 32:39) We find Christ in the Eucharist at Holy Communion and at Adoration. Good stewards need to pray, to pray for the courage to follow Christ’s call to stewardship. (continued on page 7)

“The causes that lead to such painful decisions as abortion are of course many and complex. If, on one hand, faithful to her Lord’s commandment, the Church never tires of reaffirming that the sacred value of every human being’s life originates in the Creator’s plan, on the other hand, she encourages the promotion of every initiative in support of women and families in order to create the favorable conditions in which to welcome life, and the protection of the family institution founded on the marriage between a man and a woman. Not only has permitting recourse to the termination of pregnancy not solved the problems that afflict many women and a fair number of families, but it has also made another wound in our society, unfortunately, already burdened by deep suffering.”

40TH ANNIVERSARY OF HUMANAE VITAE

This Friday, 25 July, marks 40 years since Pope Paul VI issued his encyclical letter, *Humanae Vitae*, Of Human Life. It is noteworthy that as acceptance and use of contraception have increased in our society, so have acceptance and use of abortion.

One should note that the encyclical’s message is broader than the rejection of birth control. It is a declaration of the dominion of God over human life, and of the full beauty of human sexuality. The problem of our age is not that it is obsessed with sex, but that it is afraid of it – afraid of the full dimensions of its claim on human commitment, self-sacrifice, and generosity – afraid of the fact that authentic sex does not let us get lost in ourselves and our pleasures, but demands that we give of ourselves for the good of the other, including the children God may give us.

The fourth Eucharistic virtue is **Reverence (honor and respect, felt and shown)**. Pope Benedict wrote, **“It is impossible to give the Eucharist too much reverence.”** How we approach Communion, how we act before, during, and after Mass (while Christ remains near us in the tabernacle), and how we come dressed for Mass (modestly) demonstrate our reverence for the Eucharist—Christ’s Real Presence here on earth!

The final Eucharistic Virtue is **Joy**. Christ died for us and then gave us Himself in the Eucharistic! **How could we not be joyful?** One way is through living stewardship. “Without cost you have received; without cost you are to give.” (Matthew 10:8) Christ asks us to match His generosity. When we **joyfully give our time, talent, and treasure**, we must do so in true gratitude for His generosity, a generosity we can never match!

Take time to consider **your life** relative to these Eucharistic Virtues and how they support your stewardship life. Take time to consider your belief in the Eucharist. Is Christ truly present to you in the Eucharist? Is Holy Communion more than a “social event” to you? Are you prepared through Reconciliation to receive Him? Are you living a Eucharistic life in Christ’s stewardship between Sunday Masses?

If you believe and are a disciple, then you are called to live these virtues at Mass and then as a good steward everywhere you go. **Do so joyously and Christ will be even more generous to you than you are in His Name!**
